The meeting came to order at 7:36 pm

1. Introductions: Joe Reynolds introduced Linda Cohen to the rest of the board.

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Linda told us about herself. One of her first careers was an an editor for Random House Publishing Company where she initially developed a school program for a book called "Fish Do The Strangest Things". This project was the first in her long series of marine science education endeavors.

After moving to the Hartshorne Woods section of Middletown, she began working at the New Jersey Marine Sciences Consortium at Sandy Hook – almost 30 years ago. Through her experiences there she realized that she had a passion for teaching about marine life and creating motivating, fun materials for students. With this in mind she developed a program called "Ocean Discoveries", a grade relevant science program for K – 8 funded by the local Parent's Associations. For a span of 20 years she happily travelled to schools throughout the state with her live animals and handson experiments.

Linda has been a board member of the Fort Hancock Advisory Committee since it's inception and is working toward the renovation of the historic buildings on Fort Hancock. Her dream is to create a marine science museum on Sandy Hook with the involvement of her new colleagues at SAVE COASTAL WILDLIFE. 2. Vote for Linda Cohen for new board member: Joe Sheridan motioned to add Linda to the Board. Samantha seconded all in favor. None opposed.

3. Approval of November 18, 2020 minutes Cait moved to approve the minutes, Joe S second. All in favor. None opposed.

4. 2020 IRS 990N taxes and 2021 NJ State paperwork: Joe paid our 2020 federal taxes. He submitted our paperwork for NJ Business license. He also submitted to NJ Consumer Affairs paperwork and it was approved. We need to file so we don't have to pay sales tax.

 - Vote on boat size large or small: Need a minimum of 40 people for the big boat. We decided to start with the small boat. Let's ask people in our next email if they are interested in a sunset tour in August. Linda suggested a theme-based tour, i.e. educators on board.
 - We decided to put together a separate planning committee for the event. Joe will reach out to Captain Dan.

7. Public Outreach in 2021: Ocean Fun Days - October 9 Island Beach State Park and October 10 Sandy Hook. We should do both, Need volunteers for both. Linda and Samantha offered to help.

Ed brought up the question: Do we have a brochure? Pamphlets? Some of our own literature? We discussed the cost of publishing, etc. Cost less than \$500 when they did it for Bayshore Watershed Council. Info sheets like for seals, field guides. Ed, Samantha, Jen, Linda and Joe all volunteered to work on them. Samantha will write and edit. A brochure subcommittee should be formed.

10. Osprey Platform Installation this spring: Joe was propositioned by Matawan to build a platform on Matawan creek. Town engineer is putting up road blocks. But we are putting some up in the next few weeks. One in the Navesink River in the islands. Replacing one that we already have up. Jen talked to Ben Wurst from the Osprey Project to capture data on Osprey in Monmouth County.

11. Mussel Restoration Trial this spring: Gentleman over in Monmouth Beach came to Bayshore Watershed council meeting. Mussels he has a swampy wetland backyard connects to the Shrewsbury. Start there. Consonck point and raise some mussels. Linda offered her property. Cotton rope and put it in the water as mussels spawn, spat attaches to rope and see if we can raise them. If we can then we can start doing restoration in May.
