Air Temperature = 79 F Water Temperature = 80 F Winds = South 5-10 mph

Salinity = 29 ppt

Turbidity = Clear in shallow water

Tidal Stage = Incoming tide

Seaweed = Sea lettuce (Ulva), Red seaweed (Callophyllis cristata) - none in abundance.

Three Hauls of a seine net

500+ Atlantic Silversides (Menidia menidia)

400+ Striped Killifish (Fundulus majalis)

50+ Mummichogs (Fundulus heteroclitus)

5 juvenile Blue-claw crabs (Callinectes sapidus) YOY

4 Sand Shrimps (Crangon septemspinosa)

2 juvenile American Silver Perch (Bairdiella chrysoura) YOY

YOY = Young-of-the-year. A designation for fish or crabs that were spawned this summer or spring.

Seining is a method of taking the pulse of a local aquatic ecosystem. It's a way to gain an insight into the health of the near shore environment where many people swim and enjoy the water. It's a chance to see what is living in local waters without harming sea life.
